Further afield are Aviemore, Inverness and Elgin with the small coastal towns of the Moray Firth just a short trip away. There is so much to see and do in the area including mountain biking, hill walking, bird watching, golfing and much more. Of course, you may just want to relax and enjoy the ambience of Speyside. Nearby Lochs Morlich and Insh provide excellent natural bases for water sports and family fun.

Granttown on Spey is situated about 34 miles south-east of Inverness. The city has its own airport from which there are daily flights to and from all corners of the UK.

The nearest train station is in Aviemore, a short 14 mile taxi journey away.

The A9, a fast trunk road, is the main link to the Highlands from the south. From the A9, just north of Aviemore, take the A 95 to Granttown on Spey.
